How To Use The Logbook

The logbook is a tool for you to keep a file of the patients who use the NASG in your clinic. We have suggested a template in the attached documents, designed to take up two side-by-side pages in a logbook. We encourage you to design your own form as you see fit for your own clinical setting.

To use the logbook, you should fill it out every time you place an NASG on a patient or a patient arrives to your facility already wearing an NASG. The following pieces of information are those we suggest you record:

- 1. Patient record number/file number
- 2. Date patient arrived
- 3. Weeks pregnant
- 4. Haemorrhage diagnosis (a key is included in the logbook with abbreviations for common diagnoses)
- 5. Whether the patient arrived already wearing the NASG
- 6. Date and time the NASG was placed
- 7. Date and time the NASG was removed
- 8. Patient's outcome (whether patient survived or died)
- 9. Comments

If there is other information that you feel are important to record, you can add columns to the logbook as needed.
